By the time you  
read this, it may  
already be Spring.  
And what does  
Spring make us

think of here at Marquette? Baseball? Flowers? Warm weather? Girls soccer? Summer being right around the corner? Yes, we do think about all of the above. But first and foremost we think about registration for the next school year--and why students choose to register here or somewhere else.

Since we are all a part of the Marquette family I feel comfortable sharing the following information. I share this so that you may then have an answer when asked and also so that you do not base your answer on what Marquette may have had in terms of resources or been like back "in the day" when you walked the halls.

So here in no particular order are comments I hear out in the public.

### **Marquette is too expensive.**

No doubt Marquette is not cheap. But check out the prices of most other private institutions and you will discover that Marquette is a bargain. In America, everyone knows that people will pay for a quality product. If you do not think Marquette offers a quality product then you are not paying attention to our graduation rates, national test scores, college scholarships, attention given to students, safety and security provided, etc. All you have to do is come and see for yourself and stop being or listening to the naysayers who seem to look for reasons to put us down.

Sometimes paying for an education is a sacrifice. I know parents who will give up something material (i.e. a summer home, an extended vacation, and extravaganzas) in order to send their child to a Catholic school.

And to cut the price, we are allowed to give out scholarships and financial aid to make Marquette more affordable. If you know someone who really wants to attend Marquette, but are afraid they may not be able to afford it—have them contact us and we will see what can be worked out. Approximately \$150,000. was given to those who had a financial need. Roughly 25% of our students receive financial aid.

### **Marquette is too small.**

Since when is a low student-teacher ratio a negative? Besides if a lot of the people saying Marquette is too small would send their son/daughter here we wouldn't be so small. Regardless of our size, we are going to take the students who come to us and do the best possible job we can with them and lavish them with attention. We may be small, but we think we're big. We may be a small school—but we're a big family.

### **Marquette is in an old building.**

As an "old" history teacher I do not see Marquette as being old. I look at the building and see history, tradition, architectural beauty, and yes, home. Come on inside and some things may look the same as in yesteryear, but I guarantee you it is not. We are a 21st century school in a 20th century building.

### **Marquette lacks technology.**

We do not lack in anything. Keep in mind we are a small school. How many computers and computer labs do we need for our student body? Every full time English, Science, Math, and Social

Studies teacher has and uses a smart board in class. We have laptops available throughout the school. Our computer classes are tied in with the LCCC curriculum and our lab tech has certification from numerous LCCC courses. Therefore, our students can get college credit.

Our science department has purchased some of the latest tech equipment to use in their labs. And we are sending one of our teachers to a workshop in Texas to be trained in teaching and using the latest technology in a pre-engineering class we are instituting.

### **Marquette's curriculum is lacking.**

Please. Don't even go there. We are a college prep school. We do not offer all the extras and bells and whistles many public schools have. We are trying to get most of our students into college. And we are doing pretty well. (Quick, name any other metro east school which graduated 63 students and three were accepted into Notre Dame. Name a school which got two into ND. How about one.)

Getting back to the numbers of courses offered, keep in mind that an Honor student at Marquette must have 25 credits (not counting PE) to graduate. Our college prep students must have 22.5 credits (excluding PE). Those credits have to include 4 years of English; 3 years of Math; 3 years of Science; 3 years of Social Studies. Many students actually take more than the required load. And seriously, thank goodness for the public schools because we can send students to JB Johnson for specialized classes.

### **Marquette's Math department is weak.**

This one has grown into urban myth proportions. Most of our advanced

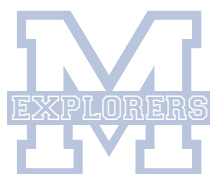

### Principal Slaughter's Message (Cont.)

Math students end up taking 5 years of Math in 4 years. Our ACT scores in Math remain higher than the national and state averages. In AP Calculus we averaged 3.55 with 5 being the highest possible score. We had three 5's and four 4's out of 11 students.

We also have teachers who have the patience needed to teach those students who are not "gifted" in Math. Even the non-math inclined student will receive 3 years of Math and wind up with a pretty good background.

### Marquette teachers are not certified in their fields.

This is an age old knock against most private schools. The truth of the matter is our teachers actually are certified and very knowledgeable in their field. We do not have tenure, therefore I will not take a more senior teacher and have them teach another subject just to keep them on staff. To remain on staff you must be certified, knowledgeable, caring, and effective.

### Marquette is not "Catholic" enough.

This one has actually been thrown at me and it is an insult. So, I'll just leave it alone.

### My son/daughter will choose where they want to go.

Man, have times changed. Parents used to tell their children where they were going to school. This is the most common excuse I hear today as to why someone is not attending Marquette. I guess these same 13 and 14 year olds are also choosing doctors, dentists, insurance, health care providers, where the family will live and on and on ad nauseum.

### Marquette has too many rules.

We also have order, discipline, and control. Yes, the administration, teachers, and staff do run the school. Most parents are thankful for that.

If you made it to the end, thanks. I feel better now.

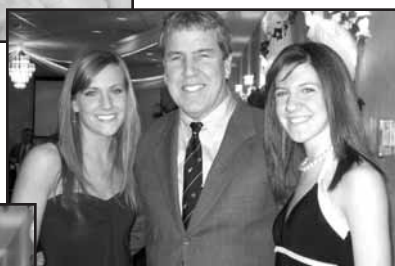
## Father/Daughter Dance

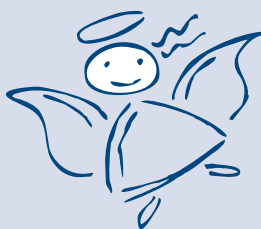

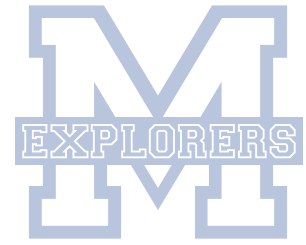

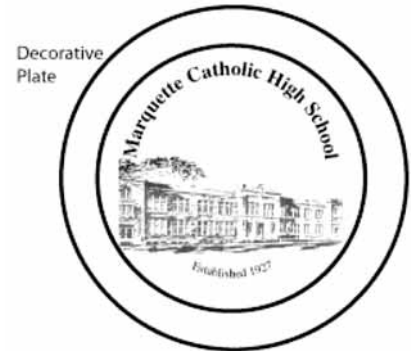
