So, what are we doing different? I really don’t know if I can put my finger on any one thing.



It is with great enthusiasm that I write to tell you about an exciting and important step taken at Marquette Catholic High School during 2007. Due to the great efforts of many people, the Marquette Catholic High School Foundation was established to encourage and facilitate the growth and development of our school for future generations.

The goals of the Foundation include:

- seeking and increasing endowment funds;
- providing information and assistance to persons contemplating charitable gifts;
