Dear Alumni, Parents and Friends of Marquette Catholic High School:

The new school year has begun and your School Board and I thank you for your commitment to Marquette Catholic High School. It has been a busy summer and we are writing to update you on what's been happening.

First of all, we want to thank the interim principal, Greg DeCoursey and the administrative staff who worked diligently to prepare for the start of school. Everything began as planned. Our fine faculty and staff were eager to welcome the students of the '05-'06 school term.

The search for a new principal is well underway. Advertisements were placed, resumes were accepted and the search committee began its process in mid-August, with the goal of recommending a candidate or candidates, to the full school board for a final selection. We do not have a timetable for this process and our goal is to find the best possible candidate, no matter how long it takes. In the meantime, we are very confident that the existing administrative staff under the direction of Mr. DeCoursey will stay the course.

The board's finance committee has fine-tuned the budget and we are pleased that, despite a dip in enrollment, the budget is balanced without the elimination of any academic or extra-curricular programs. While we remain concerned with enrollment, the current dip is not a surprise as the enrollment at the primary feeder schools has also been declining. In fact, in the period from 1995 through 2004, primary feeder school enrollment has fallen 12.8%. Marquette's enrollment declined over

the same period by 7.1%. Nonetheless, one of our primary goals is providing an educational opportunity that is attractive and affordable to increasing numbers of students and their families in southwestern Illinois.

The board's development committee reports that our various activities and fund-raising committees are in place. The \$100,000 Mega-Raffle campaign is already underway with the final drawing set for Saturday, October 1. We are confident that with your support and the support of the community that the development committee's goal of raising nearly \$240,000 will be achieved. In addition, the student recruitment efforts within the development office are ongoing and we believe will bear fruit in the coming years. Lastly, the development office is completing the process of creating some new materials that define the Marquette experience. Building upon our image will be one of our main focuses as we move forward.

The coming year poses many challenges and exciting times. We continue to work with the diocese and Bishop Lucas to move to self-governance. Much of the groundwork for the transition has been laid, but much remains to be done. The process should be complete by the end of the upcoming school year. Once we have moved to self-governance, the next anticipated step is the formation of a foundation. This will be a vehicle for increasing our financial assistance packages, which is key to sustaining and increasing enrollment.

While we work diligently to accomplish what has been outlined above, we must always keep our primary work in mind. We are here to provide our children

with a quality Christian education in the Catholic tradition. Nothing is more important than this!

We have included many of the schedules and events happening this fall. If none of these fit your schedule, we invite you to come by the school and engage the Marquette experience on campus. Recently, the Class of 1960 stopped in for a tour before their reunion and was impressed with the facility and excited to see the progress. So many things have changed, yet the feeling of belonging was still with them. We hope you will also be able to have the same experience in the near future.

Students place first in Entrepreneurship Boot Camp this summer

Bridget Buckley, daughter of John and Kathy Buckley of Alton, and William Morgan, son of Diane Morgan of Madison, recently won first place in business plan competition at the CEO Entrepreneurship Boot Camp in Carbondale, Illinois. The two Marquette seniors excelled in competition of developing a business plan for an after-school teen lounge that they called "The Kick it". During the week-long camp the students engaged in many activities designed to provide insight into developing and running a business. While the students had a full agenda for the week, they also developed a business plan and presented it to a panel of judges on the last day.

In an effort to promote youth entrepreneurship, the Entrepreneurship Center of Southern Illinois University Edwardsville sponsored two students from Marquette Catholic High School at a week long youth entrepreneurship camp. Camp CEO, a residential camp for high school students, was held during mid June. This innovative camp exposed the campers to all aspects of business development and ownership. The twelve campers participated in business activities including: executive team building, a formal networking reception, a business etiquette dinner, business and financial institution site visits, a visit to the local newspaper, and a business plan contest competing for actual start-up capital. This concept was not only embraced by the support of other Illinois Entrepreneurship Network partners, but also enjoyed the financial support and sponsorship from many local businesses and civic groups.

"I really liked the chance to gain the field experience in business by meeting loan officers at the banks, and actual business owners of a deli and a restaurant", said Morgan. Buckley said, "The camp was a great experience and so much fun. I still keep in touch with some of the other camp participants."

Mrs. Mary Mager was instrumental in identifying the students for the camp. "I was ecstatic upon hearing the news that William and Bridget had placed first in the competition. Even though Marquette does not currently offer business courses, our commitment to excellence affords our students to achieve outside the realm of our curriculum." Mager said.

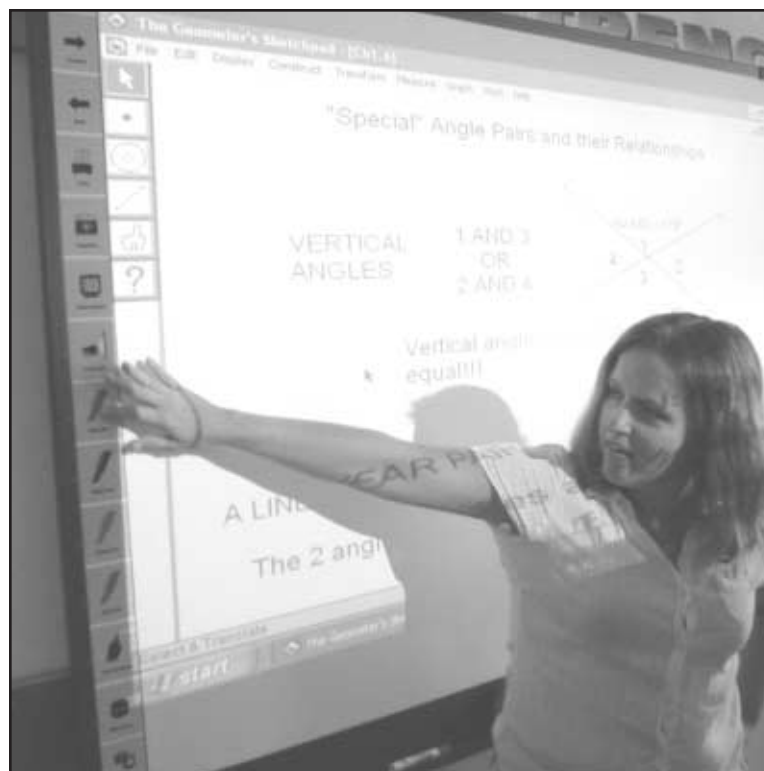

Marquette Catholic High School is starting its 79th school year on August 25, 2005. As in past years, Marquette has a well rounded group of kids and a hard working and dedicated staff. The 2005 graduating class of 84 had 8851 hours of community service and was offered 1 million dollars in scholarships to many outstanding colleges and universities. In addition to our college preparatory classes, many students choose to take advanced placement courses. Our students have traditionally scored extremely well on the AP tests. This year's graduating class is no exception. On the Chemistry test, 70% earned a perfect score, and 30% earned a 4 on scale of 1 – 5 with a 5 being a perfect score. On the Government test, 60% scored a 3 or above. AP Calculus, 80% scored a 3 or above.

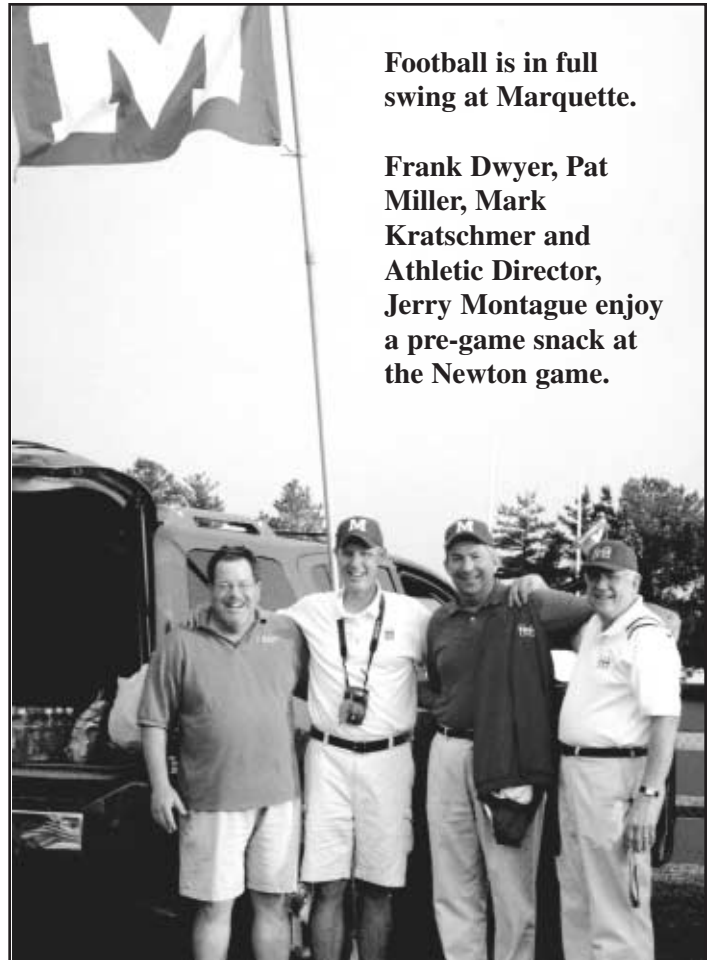

Memorial Fund Set Up For Drew Schmidt



A memorial scholarship fund has been set up in memory of Drew Schmidt from the class of 2004. Drew was the son of Tom and Sue (Chiolero) Schmidt and brother to Emily (Class of 1999) and Adam (Class of 2007). Drew died in a car accident at the age of 20 while he was home on summer break. The Telegraph described Drew as being "one of the best of the best." He loved all sports at Marquette but was a stand out on the basketball court. Drew helped his Explorer basketball team win 26 games his junior and senior year at Marquette and went on to play college basketball at Culver Stockton College after graduation. "Drew would run through a wall for me if I asked him to," former basketball coach John Ducey said. "I cannot think of a single young man who I enjoyed coaching more. We went through a lot," he added. Drew's baseball coach, Greg DeCoursey agreed. "He was such a good kid," he said, "Marquette's kind of unique. It's like one big family. When one of us dies, it's like a death in the family."

The Drew Schmidt Memorial Scholarship will benefit students at Marquette. The application criteria is being determined and will be available on our website in the spring. This summer, Marquette will hold a golf tournament in memory of Drew and all of the proceeds will go to the Drew Schmidt Memorial Scholarship Fund.
