Dear Alumni, Parents/Guardians, and Friends of Marquette:



Did you realize that Marquette is entering its 80th school year? Happy 80th birthday to us. I know that we will be planning some sort of activities to commemorate

such a momentous occasion—there will be more on that later.

In my first letter to you last year, I mentioned that there seemed to be a certain amount of pessimism/negativism about the present and future of Marquette Catholic. There are varying theories as to what generated these feelings, but I am very happy to report that the amount of pessimism/negativism has certainly declined. It has not disappeared, but I am hearing more positive and optimistic statements all the time.

And, truth be told, there is a reason for optimism. A lot of good things are happening here. Foremost, is the academic record we are producing. Through the hard work of our faculty, parents, and students we are graduating students who are ready for the challenges of college life. Through our AP courses and dual credit courses many of our graduates are starting college having already earned college credit. For example, we have a graduate at the Illinois Institute of Technology who began his freshman year with 39 credit hours. Another student at Mizzou began his first year with 24 credit hours. And our three freshmen at Notre Dame averaged between 17-24 credit hours. And this is to mention only a few.

We were also pleased to report that last years graduating class again exceeded the state and national averages on the ACT. As far as I could determine we also exceeded all the Metro East area schools.

As far as the condition and looks of the physical plant—many of you alumni would be very proud of the “new” Marquette. We have been able to do a lot of work in the basement rooms where our science department is stationed. New look labs and new equipment equal new outlooks and attitudes. And much of the money for these projects came directly from many of you purchasing memorial bricks, blocks, and benches.

If you haven't seen the memorial walk out in front of the school, I think you are going to be very pleased. For some of you who live out of town, pictures will be posted on our Web site. For those of you who do live in the area, please make a point in stopping by and checking it out. Many of you who did not participate in the first phase may want to participate in the second phase which will be run in the late spring and early summer of 2007. Mark on your calendars that we are planning a dedication ceremony at 5:00 pm on October 7 (following the Homecoming game and before the Mega Raffle drawing) for all who purchased the bricks, blocks, or benches in their name or someone else's.

If you can come by or even if you just use the web, check out the new gym entrance, marquee, and bleachers. Yes, Marquette finally has a marquee. How long have we been talking about that?

We have actually had some alumni stop by the school and have wanted to be

shown around. We have no problem with that. There is usually someone available to give you a tour. After all, this is your high school. And if we are going to continue to ask for donations (which we are) then you, the investors, should have the right to see what you are investing in. By the same token, if you are thinking about sending a son/daughter here, you might want to come by during the school day to get a real picture of what goes on. I think you will like it.

A Message from **Mark Kratschmer, Renaissance Society** **President and Marquette parent:**

Renaissance-“enthusiastic and vigorous activity along literary, artistic and cultural lines distinguished by a revival of interest...by an increasing pursuit of learning and imaginative response to broader horizons.”

Under the leadership of Mike Slaughter, with the dedication of the entire Marquette faculty and staff, Renaissance is exactly what is happening at Marquette.

As has been noted recently, the Marquette students are excelling academically, athletically and spiritually. Seventy of 73 from the class of 2006 went on to further their education. The other three are serving our country. The entire class took the ACT and averaged 22.1. That is the highest average in the region. The Marquette class average exceeded the State of Illinois average by 2.5 points. The Scholar bowl and WYSE teams both advanced to state competition.

The athletic teams, both women and men, compete at high levels within the conference, with several advancing to state competition. Several students have gone on to compete in college.

Perhaps most impressive is the spirituality and dedication to others that the students exhibit. The entire student body averages well over 40 hours of recorded service annually. Recently, two students were recognized for performing over 100 service hours.

With this brief overview, it is easy to understand why I encourage you to join the Renaissance Society- the honorary society that recognizes Marquette supporters who contribute \$1000 or more to the Annual Campaign. The Renaissance Society was formed in 1989. Last year, some 70 supporters contributed nearly \$85,000 in support of Marquette. This has become an important part of the budget and allows Marquette to keep tuition manageable.

Enclosed with this newsletter is an envelope for the Annual Appeal. Please consider becoming a Renaissance Society member. Your contribution will help the faculty and staff provide that “enthusiastic and vigorous...literary, artistic and cultural...pursuit of learning” that has become synonymous with Marquette.

No More Fundraising??

I wonder how our supporters—both individuals and businesses, would respond if Marquette stopped soliciting them for handouts. I bet no one would complain. Some would jump for joy. Between us, the Catholic grade schools, and the public schools, everyone is being bombarded for handouts.

Here is the simple Math for how we get Marquette out of the fundraising business. We have over 6000 alumni. If every one of us would give \$50.00 just once a year, that would amount to \$300,000. If we gave \$100.00 once a year, that of course, would be \$600,000. If we brought in between three and six hundred thousand a year—we wouldn't need phonathons, golf tournaments, auctions, etc, etc, etc. We could leave the cutthroat world of fundraising to the other schools. We would just have "fun" raisers and not have to worry about how much we made.

Will it happen? It could. But until then we will just have to keep depending on these fundraisers and keep hoping we get a thousand plus here and there to make up for those alumni who don't give anything.

Is a \$50-\$100 gift asking too much. For some, probably. For most of us, no. Think about how much you spend on any given weekend on food, entertainment, etc.

Here's my promise, if we bring in over \$350,000. in our alumni appeal, you will see a very significant cut in other fundraisers and Marquette solicitations.
