Katrina Act Provides Special Window of Opportunity

Under a new law, donations made until Dec. 31, 2005 to qualified charities like Marquette Catholic High School, qualify for special tax treatment. Taxpayers may deduct charitable contributions up to 100 percent of their adjusted gross income, up from 50 percent.
